24/7 Response Centre

The Response Centre has been in full operation for over a month now and has proven its worth. Our response time to Alarm calls has been reduced from 20 minutes to less than 10 minutes in most cases. Our service to the Commissionaire in the field has improved considerably through our Lone Worker check system and responding to vacancies at the work site.

In the next few weeks we will have GPS tracking with all of our Mobile vehicles that the Response Centre will monitor. This will aid in the dispatching of vehicles to any site as we will know the closest vehicle to the site requiring aid or backup.

We are negotiating a contract with Prices Alarms that will increase the work load for our Mobiles and the Response Centre. To accomplish this we will have one dedicated phone line in the Response Centre for all incoming Alarms. The main line of 727 7755 local 101 will be used for general enquiries and for the Lone Worker program.
